Nor is it necessary that such information should be furnished for that purpose, because all the data afforded by the official records in this Department that may have a bearing upon any such claim are always furnished, upon his request therefor, to the official charged by law with the adjudication of the claim.

No possible hardship can result from the operation of this rule, because all that it is necessary for a claimant for pension under the Missouri law to do is to make his claim to the Adjutant General of the State in accordance with his own knowledge of the facts, and to furnish such testimony as he may be called upon to furnish, being assured that all the information afforded by the official records in the War Department that has a bearing upon the claim will be promptly furnished to that official upon his request therefor.

## Pension for Ex-Confederate Soldiers

Application for the purpose of certifying those entitled to obtain pension under the terms of C. S. H. R. 465, 47th General Assembly, State of Missouri.

**I DO SOLEMNLY SWEAR TO THE FOLLOWING FACTS:**

1. That I am a bona fide resident of Missouri, and have been for two years preceding April 23, 1913, and am at present residing at Draw, Mo Missouri;
2. That I am an Ex-Confederate soldier and served for not less than six months in the army of the Confederate States of America in the late Civil War as per my record given below;
3. That I was honorably discharged therefrom and, as evidence, will submit my discharge papers to the Adj. Gen. of Missouri; or certificate of service to be obtained from the Adj. Gen. U.S.A. at Washington, D.C.

4. That I am not an inmate of the Confederate Home at Higginville, or any other similar institution, but that

(a) on account of wounds received (state nature of wounds) \_\_\_\_\_

(b) or on account of disease contracted (state nature of disease) Eyes diseased and loss of one eye on account of measles

(c) and on account of old age (state age) Seventy Six years

I am incapacitated to labor, and have no business or profession, or property from which I may derive an income, and no means sufficient for my support. (State if applicant has any property in wife's name, or if he has children or any other relations who should support him)

No Property - and no children able to support me

Subscribed and sworn to before me this 30<sup>th</sup> day of August 1913.

My commission expires May 27 1916.
